We hope you find this resource useful and your pupils enjoy exploring the books in a fresh new environment.




Where's Mrs Ladybird?

Teachers love these books because they are beautiful but tough enough to withstand even the most enthusiastic of young readers. And children love them because they are just so much fun.










Watch Out for Muddy Puddles!

A joyous celebration of the imagination and splashing in puddles by the star of CBeebies' Mr Bloom and the bestselling illustrator of Aliens Love Underpants.




Mad About Minibeasts!

Each page introduces a different animal, with a short read-aloud rhyme.




Nature Trail








A World Full of Animal Stories: 50 favourite animal folk, tales, myths and legends






The Leaf Thief


That's MY flower!

Join Squirrel and Bird as they discover and explore the wonderful nature of spring... and learn a few things along the way.






Finding Wild




What Do You See When You Look at a Tree


The Hodgeheg

Still determined to fulfil his mission, Max discovers the best way to cross the road - with the help of the lollipop lady and some careful detective work...








The Call of the Silver Wibbler: Kate on the Case




My Heart was a Tree

There are stories from an ancient olive remembering Odysseus and Penelope, and from a eucalyptus that gave shelter to a koala; from a piece of driftwood that was made into a chair, and from a tiny sapling carried by a refugee as a reminder of home - these are poems and stories that will amuse, move and energise families and readers of all ages to appreciate the beauty and wonder of trees.

Indigo and her brother Quigley head off to rescue their parents. On their journey they come across many magical and extraordinary new creatures, but their parents are nowhere to be seen. Fortunately, there are other people studying the wildlife in the Unknown Wilderness. But do the people Indigo and Quigley meet really have the best intentions? Or are they capturing the magical creatures for their own gain?

Wild Child: A Journey Through Nature

Author: Dara McAnulty Interest age: 7-11 years

Wild Child: A Journey Through Nature is a beautiful book, illustrated in full colour by Barry Falls, and divided into five sections: looking out of the window, venturing out into the garden, walking in the woods, investigating heathland and wandering on the river bank.

Dara pauses to tell you about each habitat and provides fantastic facts about the native birds, animals and plants you will find there - including wrens, blackbirds, butterflies, tadpoles, bluebells, bees, hen harriers, otters, dandelions, oak trees and many more. Each section contains a discovery section where you will have a closer look at natural phenomenon such as metamorphoses and migration, learn about categorisation in the animal kingdom or become an expert on the collective nouns for birds.

Each section finishes with an activity to do when you get home: plant wild flowers, make a bird feeder, try pond dipping, make a journey stick and build a terrarium. Dara ends the book with advice for young conservationists.







After losing her parents, young Mary Lennox is sent from India to live in her uncle's gloomy mansion on the wild English moors.
