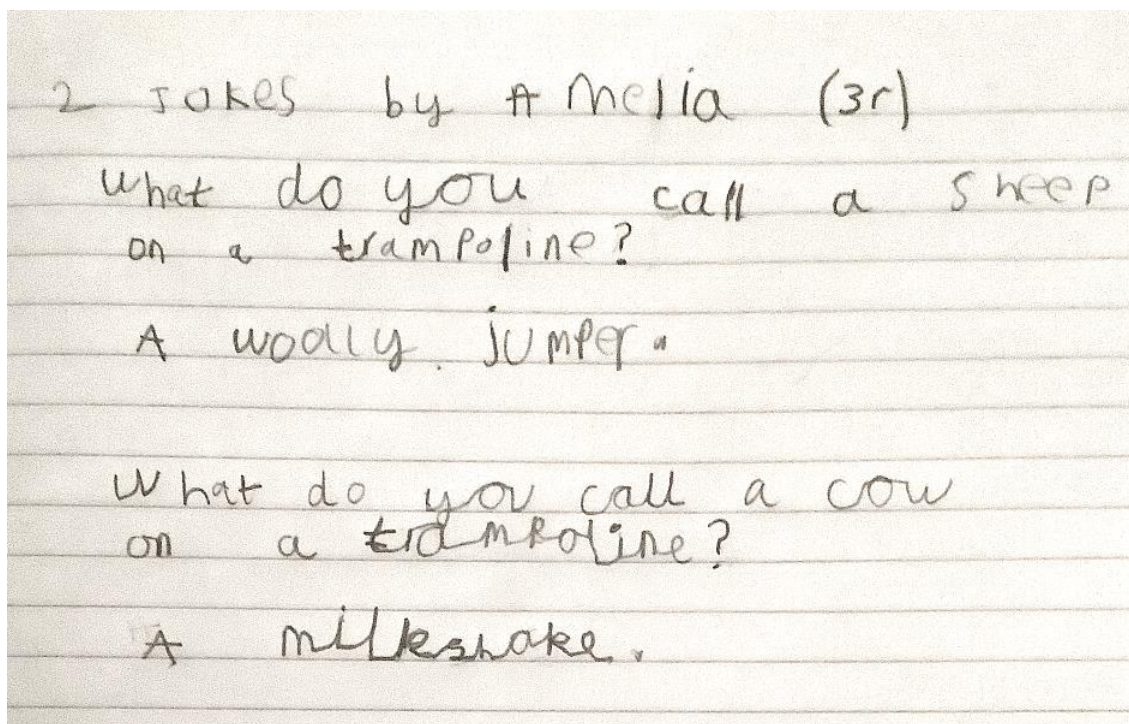

Top 10 highest goal scorers in football history by Alexei (6W)



10. Joe Brambick (616 goals)

Clubs: Glentoran, Linfield, Chelsea and Walsall

National team: Ireland

Joe Brambick was born on 3 November 1905 and died on 13 October 1983. He enjoyed a successful career playing in Ireland and England. During his playing days, he even was at the top of the all time list, before being overtaken by Josef Bican. His most noticeable contribution for a club came for Linfield. He scored 286 goals in 183 matches for them.

9. Eusebio (622 goals)

Clubs: Sporting Lourenco Marques, Benfica, Boston Minutemen, Monterrey, Toronto Metros-Croatia, Beira-Mar, Las Vegas Quicksilvers, Uniao de Tomar and New Jersey Americans

National team: Portugal

Eusebio was a brilliant footballer who is a legend for Benfica and Portugal. For Benfica he scored 473 goals in 440 games. He also won the Ballon d'or, which is the most prestigious individual award in football, in 1965. By doing so, he cemented his place in football history.

8. Gerd Muller (634 goals)

Clubs: 1861 Nordlingen, Bayern Munich and Fort Lauderdale Strikers

National team: West Germany

Gerd Muller was a legend for West Germany and Bayern Munich. His trophy cabinet was anything but empty; he won a world cup in 1974 and also the Ballon d'or in 1970. He even won the Euros in 1972. He scored 566 goals in 607 games for Bayern Munich, and 68 goals in 62 games for West Germany.

7. Jimmy Jones (647 goals)

Clubs: Belfast Celtic, Larne, Fulham, Glenavon, Portadown, Bangor and Newry Town

National team: Ireland

Jimmy Jones was a legend for Glenavon, where he scored over 500 goals. He won the Irish league and league cup 3 times. However, he didn't have a very successful international career, scoring 1 goal in 3 games.

6. Josef Bican (720 goals)

Clubs: Rapid Vienna, Admira Vienna, FC Vitkovice, FC Hradec Kralove, Dynamo Prague, Slovan Liberec and Spartak Brno ZJS

National teams: Austria, Czechoslovakia and Bohemia and Moravia

Some sources say Josef Bican has scored over 1000 goals, but only 720 were in top-level football. He still won the top scorer award 12 times. His most fruitful years were spent at Slavia Prague, scoring 535 goals in 272 games.

5. Ferenc Puskas (729 goals)

Clubs: Budapest Honved and Real Madrid

National teams: Hungary and Spain

Ferenc Puskas was an amazing striker. He is a legend for Real Madrid, Hungary and Spain, scoring a remarkable 729 goals in his career. He fixed his place in football history by being a prolific striker. In 2009, FIFA decided to honour him by introducing the Puskas award. The Puskas award is awarded to whoever scores the most beautiful goal.

4. Romario (753 goals)

Clubs: Vasco da Gama, PSV Eindhoven, Barcelona, Flamengo, Vasco da Gama, Fluminense, Al Sadd, Vasco da Gama, Miami FC, Adelaide United, Vasco da Gama and America

National team: Brazil

Romario was a legend for Brazil and Barcelona. He won the world cup in 1994, the Copa America in 1989 and 1997 and he also won the FIFA Confederations Cup in 1997, all with Brazil and also scored 55 goals in 70 games for Brazil. He also reached the champions league final in 1994, but lost 4-0 to AC Milan. He won three Eridivises with PSV Eindhoven. He even scored a hat trick in an El Classico, the biggest derby in football. After he stopped playing football, he became a lawyer.

3. Lionel Messi (756 goals but he can still add more to his tally)

Clubs: Barcelona and PSG

National team: Argentina

Lionel Messi is a player most people have heard of, mainly because he is still playing football. He is arguably the best football player of all time. He won the Ballon d'or 7 times, more than any other player. He holds the record for the most goals in a calendar year thanks to his amazing performances in 2012, scoring 91 goals across the year. He has also won 10 La ligas, 4 Champions leagues and 7 Copa del reys. He is also Barcelona's all time top scorer. Other records Messi holds are most LaLiga goals, scoring 474, most hat tricks in La Liga, achieving 36 and in the champions league he achieved 8, which is also a record. He also has most assists in LaLiga, having 192. After an emotional goodbye to Barcelona, he also won the Ligue 1 once with PSG. He is still playing to this day and has a chance to add to his tally. He will soon overtake Pele, who is currently in second.

2. Pele (765 goals)

Clubs: Santos and New York Cosmos

National team: Brazil

Pele is said to have over 1200 goals, but only 765 are official. He is arguably the best footballer of all time. He won three world cups in 1958, 1962 and 1970 with Brazil. He was very successful with both Santos and Brazil. Including friendlies, he has scored 1279 goals in 1363 games.

1. Cristiano Ronaldo (801 goals but can still add more to his tally)

Clubs: Sporting Lisbon, Manchester United, Real Madrid, Juventus and Manchester United

National team: Portugal

Cristiano Ronaldo is arguably the best footballer of all time. He has won 5 Ballon d'ors, 2 less than Messi, but has won 5 Champions leagues, 1 more than Messi. He has also won the Euros in 2016 with Portugal. He won 3 Premier leagues with Manchester United, the FA Cup 1 time, 1 Champions league and a FIFA Club World Cup 1 time. At Real Madrid he won 2 La ligas, 2 Copa del reys and 4 Champions leagues and even became their all time top goalscorer. At Juventus he won 2 Serie As, 2 Supercoppa Italianas and 1 Coppa Italia.

How to make monster cupcakes! By Joana, 6w

Ingredients

For the sponge

- 100g dark brown soft sugar
- 3 large eggs, beaten
- 4tbsp sunflower oil
- 200g Carnation Light Condensed Milk
- 150g self-raising flour
- 1tsp baking powder
- 2 medium carrots, finely grated (155g)
- 1 tsp mixed spice

For the icing

- 125g butter
- 400g icing sugar
- 100g Carnation Light Condensed Milk
- Green food colouring

For the hats

- 12 wafer ice cream cones
- 100g dark chocolate
- Coloured royal icing for decorating



Preheat the oven to 180°C (160°C with fan) Gas mark 4. Grate the carrot with a fine grater. In a separate bowl mix all the dry ingredients together, (brown sugar, self-raising flour, baking powder and mixed spice), pour over the carrots and mix well.

Whisk the eggs, oil and 200g Carnation Light Condensed Milk together and then beat into the carrot mix. Evenly spoon the mix into cupcake cases and place them into the muffin tray. Bake in the centre of the oven for approx 20 minutes until golden and springy to touch. Remove from the oven and put aside to cool.

With an electric beater, cream the butter and icing sugar together until light and fluffy. Slowly add the 100g Carnation Light Condensed Milk and the green food colouring and beat until it's all incorporated. Ice the cupcakes when completely cooled.

For the witches hats: Melt the dark chocolate in the microwave stirring every 30 seconds until smooth. Dip the bottom of the cones into the chocolate and set aside to harden. Use the coloured icing to decorate.

Why not get the whole family to decorate their own cupcakes? Use coloured sprinkles and other decorations to have some Halloween fun.

Ingredients

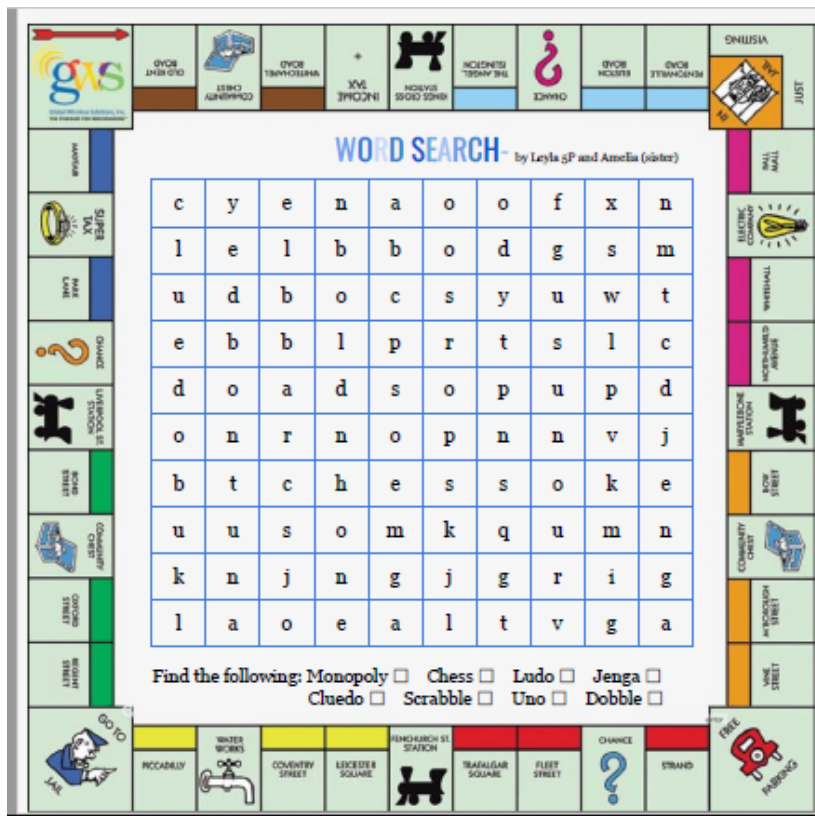
- 8 oz butter
- 1 3/4 cups caster sugar
- 2 eggs
- 2 teaspoons vanilla essence
- 3 1/2 cups plain flour
- 1 1/2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1/2 a teaspoon of salt
- 1/2 a tablespoon cocoa
- 1/2 a teaspoon ground cinnamon

Recipe

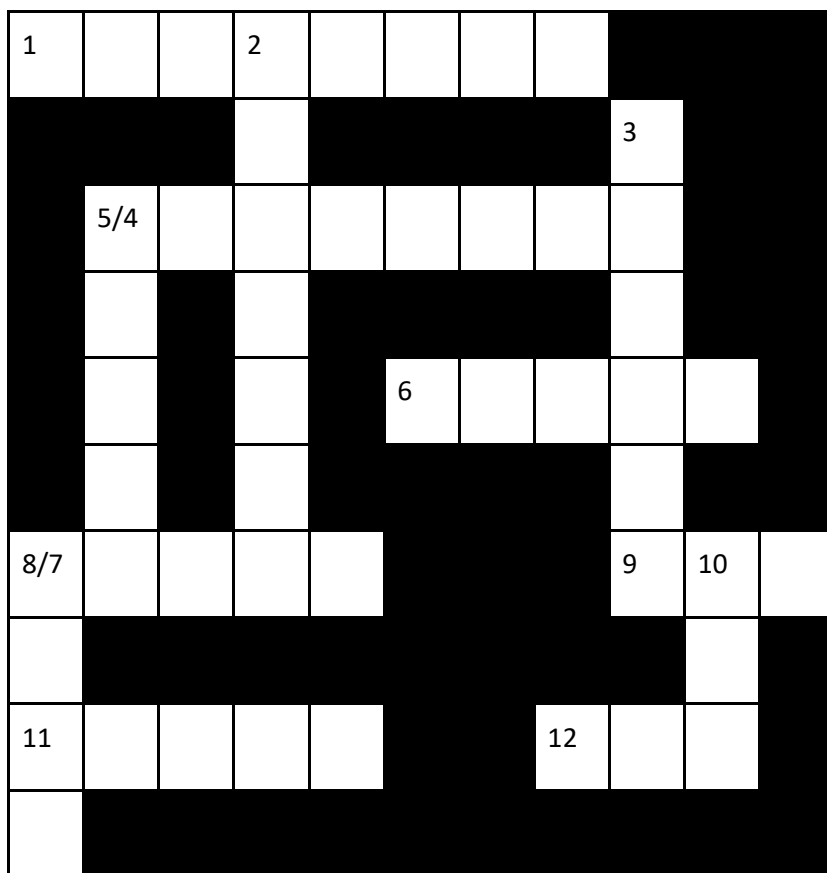
Cream butter and sugar in a mixing bowl, add eggs, vanilla and beat well. Sift and add flour, baking powder, and salt. Divide mixture in half. Add cocoa and cinnamon to half mixture. Shape each half into a rectangle 1/4 inch thick. Put one on top of each other, roll up tightly, wrap in greaseproof paper, chill then slice thinly. Bake in moderate oven 350-375, gas mark 4-5 for 10 to 15 mins.

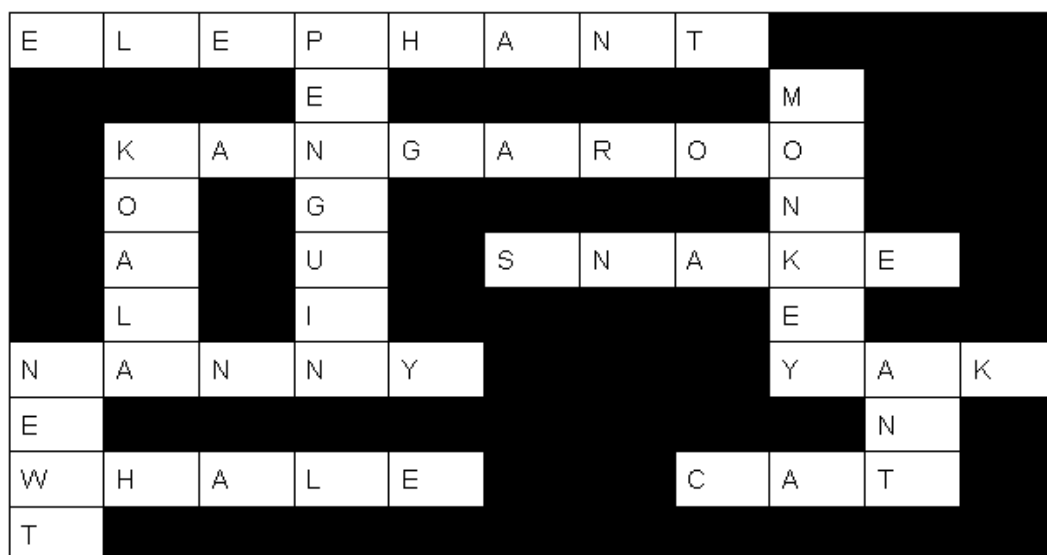

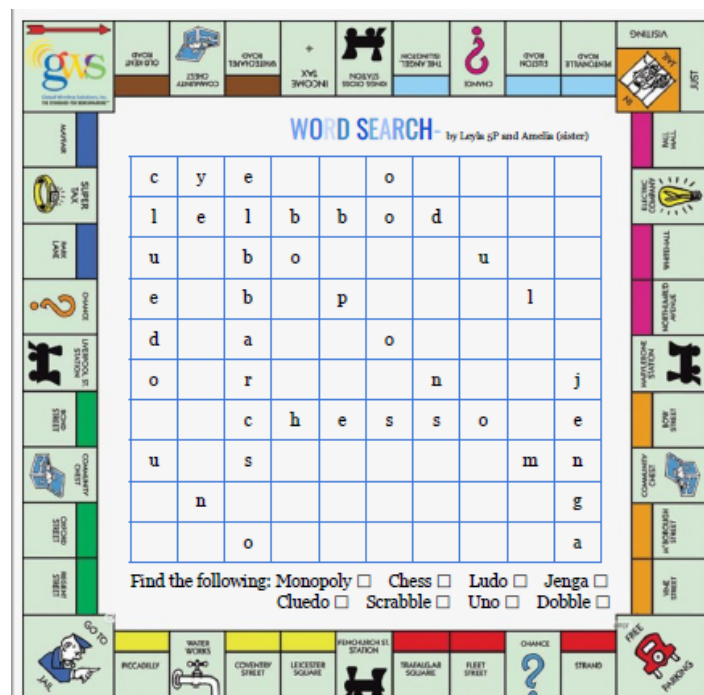
