


Mill Lane Bridge Painting project

Evolution on Nintendo by Nathan, Year 6



In 1889 Fusajiro Yamauchi, a Japanese business man in Kyoto created 'Hanafuda', a type of Japanese playing card. It was a massive success and the family made the card until 1977 when they released their first home console, the colour TV game '6' referring to the 6 games you could play on it. The first handheld Nintendo console came in 1980 with the Game and Watch. It had one game and was an incredible success for the company. The massive hit for Nintendo came in 1985 with the release of the NES (Nintendo Entertainment System) to the US and Europe and a year earlier the Famicom was released in Japan in total the NES sold over 62 million units worldwide.

Next came the Gameboy in 1989 this is the best selling console to this day with the Gameboy family (Gameboy pocket 1996, Gameboy light 1998, Gameboy colour 1998, Gameboy advanced 2001, Gameboy Advanced SP 2003 and the Gameboy Micro 2005) having over 200 million units sold. In 1991 the snes was released featuring brand new games like Mario Kart. Its controller was a successor to the NES controller featuring round edges and shoulder buttons.

Next came the Nintendo 64 with probably the oddest controller to date having its joystick in the middle. The Nintendo Cube was the smallest only TV console and used DVD for the first time in Nintendo's history. After the success of all that came before, Nintendo refocused its ideas on handheld consoles with the DS and 3DS featuring two screens and the use of cartridges to switch between games. Next came the Wii which was a huge hit being family friendly and using motion sensitive controllers to track body movement for games such as Wii sports and this technology would later be carried on to the Nintendo Switch which in 2017 became a reality and made itself comfortably in second place for units sold. To think that Nintedo came from such humble beginnings is absolutely mind blowing.





Lemon and lime cheesecakes By Georgia 4R

A simple recipe that serves 8 people and takes just 15 minutes!

INGREDIENTS:

- 100g of digestive biscuits (3 biscuits)
- 50g of butter
- 1 tbsp caster sugar
- Fresh raspberries, to garnish

FILLING:


- 1 x 250g tub mascarpone
- 1 x 375g can full-fat condensed milk
- Juice of 1 small lemon
- 3 tbsp lemon curd
- Finely grated zest and juice of 2 limes

INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. Line a baking sheet with cling film and sit 8 cooking rings (7cm/23in) on top.
- 2. Crush the biscuits with a rolling pin until they are fine crumbs.
- 3. Melt the butter in a pan and add the crumbs and sugar. Stir until combined. Using a teaspoon, press biscuit crumbs into the base of each ring to give an even layer. Transfer to the fridge to firm up while making the filling.
- 4. Measure the mascarpone and condensed milk into a bowl and whisk with an electric whisk until smooth. Add the lemon juice and curd and nearly all the lime zest (reserve some for decoration) and juice and whisk again until thick and creamy.
- 5. Spoon on top of the biscuit base in the rings. Level the tops, cover with cling film and leave to chill for a minimum 2 hours.
- 6. Run a palette knife around the inside edge of each ring to help ease the cheesecakes out onto individual plates.

 Decorate with the reserved lime zest and
 - fresh raspberries.
- 7. Enjoy!


