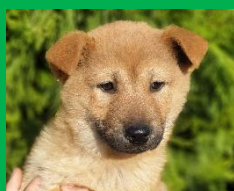

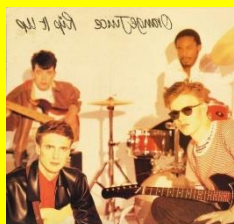

## How to make raspberry cheesecake by Felix, Year 4



### How to make raspberry cheesecake.

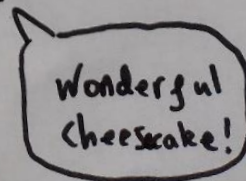
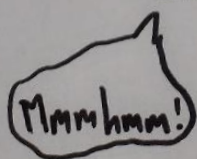
#### ingredients:

100g digestive biscuits  
50g butter, melted  
150g double cream  
300g soft cream cheese  
50g sugar  
1 tsp vanilla extract  
Squeezed lemon juice (1 squeeze)  
200g raspberries

#### Method:

1. Crush biscuits into fine crumbs. Stir in butter and press into 18cm loose-based cake tin. Bake at 180°C/Gas 4 for 10-15 mins until lightly browned. Leave to cool.
2. Softly whip double cream then beat into cheese along with sugar, vanilla and lemon juice. Stir in raspberries, leaving some for garnish.
3. Spread topping onto biscuit base. Chill at least 6 hours, then decorate with raspberries before serving.

# Chocolate nests

**Serves 10 people**

## Ingredients

- 225 g (8 oz) plain chocolate
- 50 g (2 oz) butter
- 2 tablespoons golden syrup
- 100 g (4 oz) corn flakes
- 30 Chocolate eggs
- Paper cake cases
- A baking tray with shallow pans

Note: The nests need to be stored in an airtight container in a fridge.

Eat within three days.

If you see a ⚠ sign it means you may need help from an adult

## Preparation

1. Put ten paper cases into pans in the baking tray. Break the chocolate into squares and put them in a large pan.
2. Add the butter to the pan. Dip a tablespoon in some hot water, then use the spoon to add the golden syrup.⚠
3. Heat the pan gently, stirring at all the time until the butter and chocolate have completely melted.⚠
4. Turn off the heat then add the cornflakes to the pan. Gently stir them into the chocolate until they are completely covered. Try not to crush the cornflakes.
5. Fill the paper cases with the mixture. Using the back of a teaspoon to make a hollow in the middle of the nest and push the cornflakes to the sides.
6. Arrange three mini eggs in each nest. Then put the tray in the fridge and leave it for an hour to set.
7. Take the nests out of the paper cases and put them on a plate. Keep them in the fridge until you want to eat them.

#### Afghan hound:

*The Afghan hound is a hound that is distinguished by its thick, fine, silky coat and its tail with a ring curve at the end. The breed is selectively bred for its unique features in the cold mountains of Afghanistan.*



#### Basenji:

*The basenji is a breed of hunting dog. It was bred from stock that originated in Central Africa. The Fédération Cynologique Internationale places the breed in the Spitz and primitive types. The Basenji produces an unusual yodel-like sound, due to its unusually shaped larynx.*



#### Chihuahua:

*The Chihuahua is one of the smallest breeds of dog, and is named after the Mexican state of Chihuahua. Chihuahuas remained a rarity until the early 20th century and the American Kennel Club did not register the Chihuahua breed until after 1904.*



#### Poodle:

*The poodle, called the Pudel in German and the Caniche in French, is a breed of water dog. The breed is divided into 4 varieties based on size, the Standard Poodle, Medium Poodle, Miniature Poodle and Toy Poodle, although the Medium Poodle variety is not yet universally recognised.*

The Bae Systems Harrier entered service on April the 1st 1969 and continued in service for over 40 years with its service ending in 2011. Stats:

- Crew:1
- Length:14.12m
- Wingspan:9.25m
- Speed:1065 kph
- Range:3256km

Being the first aircraft capable to take off vertically and land, the Harrier nicknamed the jump jet flew with both the UK and US air force. The versatile fighter jet saw extensive combat use through the Gulf, Falklands and in the Middle East wars so the jump jet has barely had a break from combat. With 9 different variants built with the last being the GR9. Though retired in the world of armed services, the Harrier still flies at Duxford airshow and at many others.
