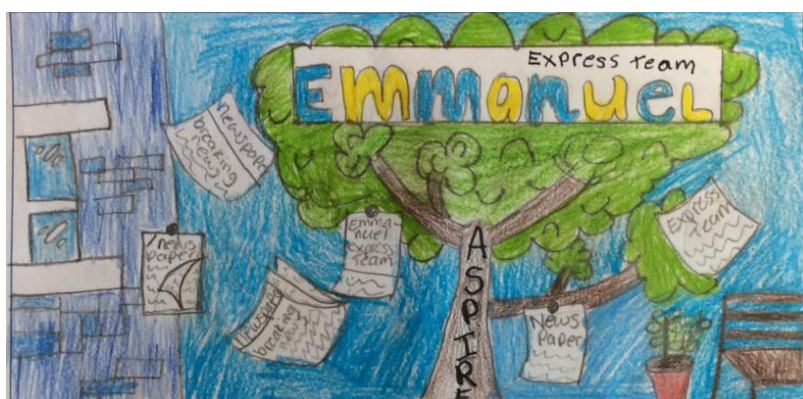
Competition winners!

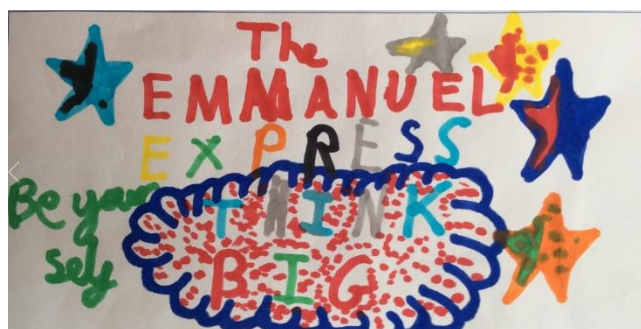

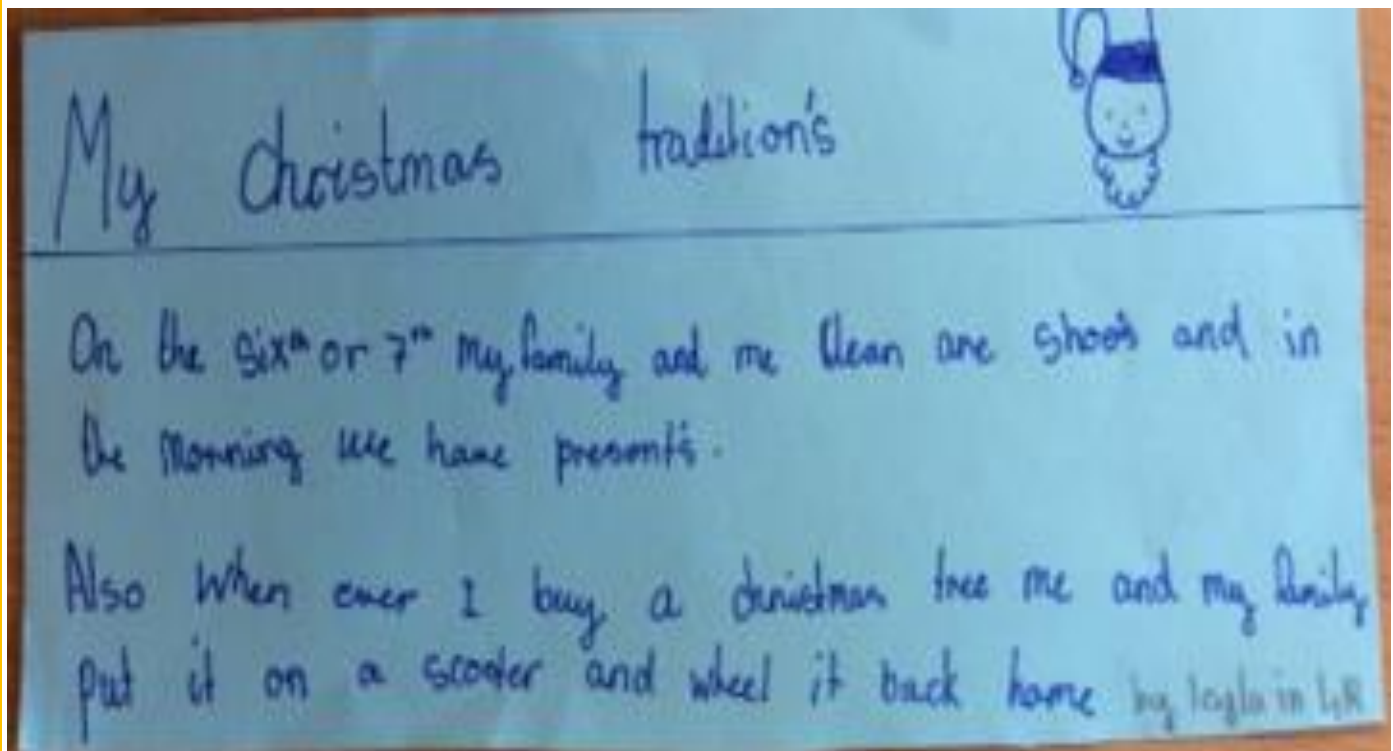

Important Navy Documents

F4 Phantom FG.1



The McDonnell Douglas F4 Phantom was first tested in mid-May 1958. 5,195 of these supersonic jets were built in its whole lifespan serving with the Navy of America, Israel, Britain, Greece, Turkey, Iran and many others still use them today in active service taking on many roles, including, fighter, strike-fighter, dive-bomber and support aircraft. The advanced jet was the best of the best for its time. It was a tandem-seat fighter. Planes like the F16, F15 and the F14 Tomcat gradually replaced it. It was used mainly in the Vietnam War. It has a top speed of Mach (faster than the speed of sound) 2.2. The fighter is an all-weather long-range interceptor. It left service in 1996. The American Blue Angels and USA Thunderbirds used it.

Reindeer Facts

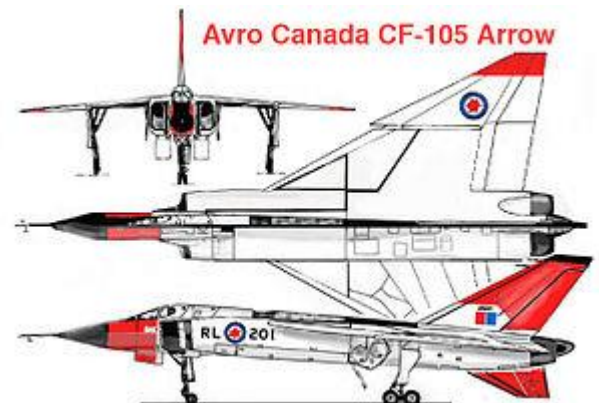

The Avro Arrow is an exquisite plane that haunts a country in their history of aircraft. In 1958, the first Arrow flew and was an extraordinary flight. The delta-winged interceptor held a promise for Canada of a new dawn whilst it reached Mach 2 at heights of 50,000 feet. It was intended as the primary plane for the RCAF (Royal Canadian Air Force). But then in 1959, the prime minister of Canada stopped the project for an unknown reason. A month later, all five Arrows were scrapped. Today, the original plans are still alive. They were told to burn them but somebody took them and saved the Arrow from extinction. Many replicas have been made and the only parts left of an original Arrow are a nose, cockpit and half of the delta wing. All parts are stored in Edenvale Aerodrome. For the 1950s, it was truly an extraordinary aircraft of its time.

The C5 Galaxy M is the latest model of the C5 Galaxy. First built in 1968 it is not planned to leave service until 2024. The top speed of the flying beast is 538mph and can fly at a height of over 41000 ft. The flight crew needed is seven personnel. This plane can fly over 7000 miles and with the aid of aerial refuelling, it can fly around the world. It can carry over 92 tons of cargo and is extremely versatile. A bit About Anglo Saxon.

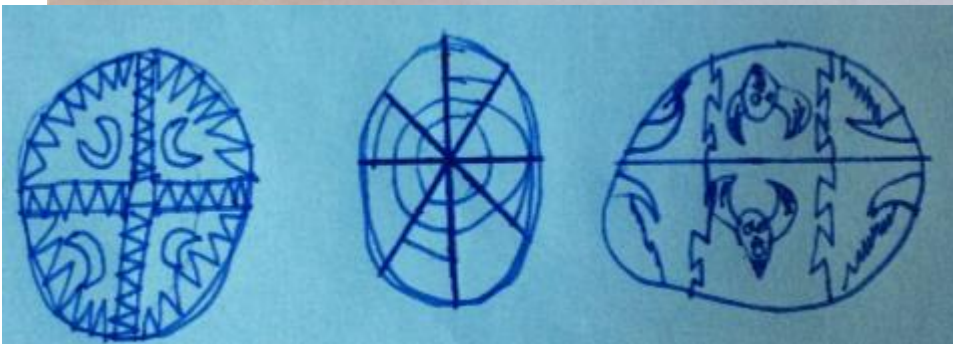
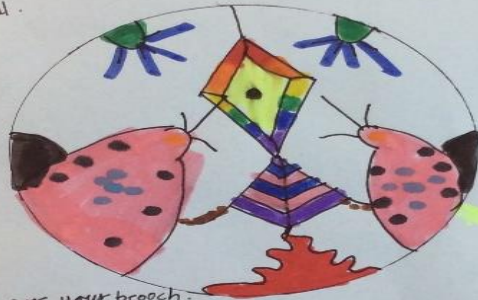
Anglo Saxon brooches were used to hold up clothes because they did not have straps. They are usually symmetrical.

You will need:

- Card
- paper
- pens/pen
- goyl (A lot)
- Felt tips

How To MAKE!

1. Create a symmetrical design for your brooch.
2. Next trace a circle onto card.
3. After Draw your design on your card.
4. Chose the main bits and make them 3D with roll up goyl.
5. Emboss the card board with goyl.
6. Then color it with felt.



You will need:

1. Foil
2. Clay
3. Cardboard circle
4. PVA glue



Steps:

1. Get the cardboard circle and the foil
2. Make a circle or another shape (or more than one) with the foil; put some PVA glue on the flat side.
3. Put the shapes and the cardboard circle together, finally wrap it in a layer of foil and it is done.

CHRISTMAS GINGERBREAD BISCUITS

Easy and yummy to make at home.

Ingredients are

- 175g dark muscovado sugar
- 85g golden syrup
- 100g butter
- 350g plain flour, plus extra for dusting
- 1 tsp bicarbonate of soda
- 1 tbsp. ground ginger
- 1 tsp ground cinnamon
- 1 egg, beaten



If you don't know what some of these are, don't worry your parents/careers will.

Get an adult to help.

- **STEP 1**

Melt the sugar, golden syrup and butter in a saucepan, then bubble for 1-2 mins. Leave to cool for about 10 mins.

- **STEP 2**

Tip the flour, bicarbonate of soda and spices into a large bowl. Add the warm syrup mixture and the egg, stir everything together, then gently knead in the bowl until smooth and streak-free. The dough will firm up once cooled. Wrap in cling film and chill for at least 30 mins.

- **STEP 3**

Remove the dough from the fridge, leave at room temperature until softened. Heat the oven to 200C/180C fan/gas 6 and line two baking trays with baking parchment.

- **STEP 4**

Roll out the dough to the thickness of a £1 coin, then cut out gingerbread people with a cutter. Re-roll the excess dough and keep cutting until it's all used up.

- **STEP 5**

Lift the biscuits onto the trays and bake for 10-12 mins, swapping the trays over halfway through cooking. Leave to cool on the trays for 5 mins, then transfer to a wire rack to cool completely. Use the icing to decorate the biscuits as you wish, and stick on chocolate or sweets for buttons. Leave to dry for 1-2 hrs. *Will keep for up to three days in an airtight container.*
