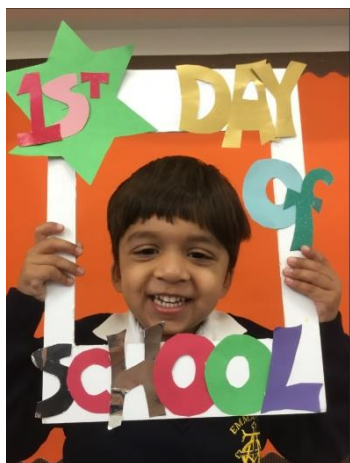

Parent/Teacher Consultations

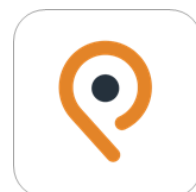

Communications

As you may have seen from my email, we are changing the way we communicate with you. ParentHub will be the main communication tool between school and parents. We will no longer use the Teacher2Parents messaging service, and as such you are free to delete the app from your phone.

The benefits of ParentHub are many. It is much more user-friendly for both the school and the parents, and provides much better value for money than our existing provider; we estimate that we will save up to £1000 per annum by using Parent Hub. It also integrates with our existing parents' evening booking software, and as a large company, they are seeking to work with other services that schools use to help streamline our services to you.

It is important that you download the app, as in-app messaging this will be the main way we communicate, not text messaging. The app symbol looks like this:



Once you have downloaded the app, you will enter your phone number and child's date of birth, which will then make you a part of our parent community. Please be assured, you are not able to enter the wrong date of birth and be connected to the wrong child, and no one who is not a parent at school can be connected to a child. There are channels for the whole school and each year group, which you will automatically be connected to, and channels for all clubs as well, which you can elect to follow. Thank you for your cooperation and support.

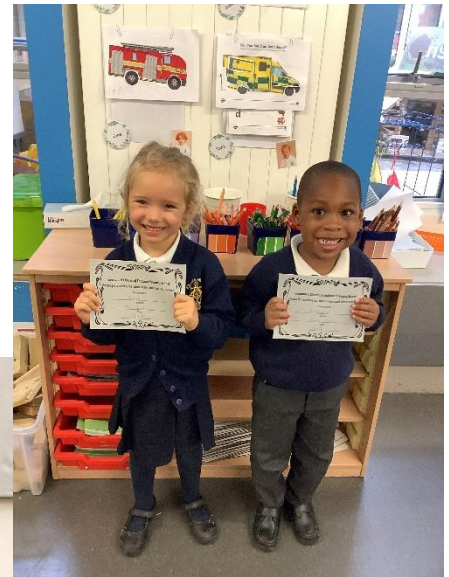

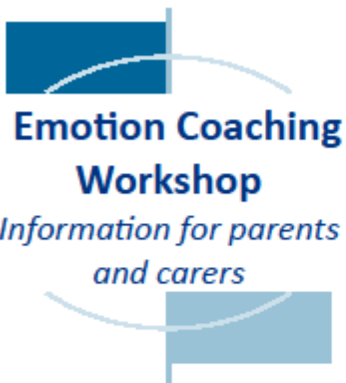
