The difference between my school in Moscow and London by Diana, 4H

- 1. In Moscow, the pupils have to be at school at around 8.10am and have lessons start at 8.30am.
- 2. My school in Moscow is several times bigger.
- 3. In my school in Moscow pupils must wear indoor shoes inside the school.
- 4. In Moscow, they write on blackboards, not on a whiteboard and computers.
- 5. In Moscow, children start to go to primary school at the age of 7.
- 6. Primary school is for 4 years, not 7.
- 7. In Moscow, desks are for 2 people, the desks are arranged in 3 lines and 5-6 rows.
- 8. In Moscow, every lesson lasts for 45 minutes and there are breaks for 10-15 minutes between lessons.
- 9. In Moscow, pupils never sit on the floor and there are only a few whole school assemblies a year.
- 10. Pupils must bring their books and notebooks every day to school.
- 11. Since the lessons start early, pupils have their second breakfast at around 10.00am.
- 12. Usually pupils have 6 lessons and finish school at 2.10pm and they have lunch at home.
- 13. In Moscow, pupils have to do a lot of homework every day.
- 14. In Moscow, the discipline during the lessons is very strict.


Elsi's review of the restaurant 'Took Took' (Elsi,1Z)

My mummy had ginger beef with rice. She really enjoyed it and she said she could really taste the ginger in the sauce.


We gobbled it all up!







Ella's art (3R)






