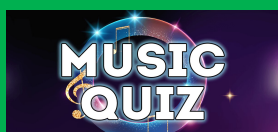

The coolest (and oddest) Easter traditions

On the run up to Easter, everyone has their own way of celebrating. Here are some cool traditions from around the world.

- Osterbrunnen. A German festival where people decorate fountains with colourful flowers and ribbons.
- In Ethiopia, people often go vegan to celebrate Easter.
- Make an omelette. Residents of Haux, France, serve an enormous omelette on Easter Monday. They use more than 4,500 eggs and feed up to 1,000 people.
- Start a bonfire. In northwest Europe, many people light bonfires to celebrate the end of winter and the new spring ahead of them.
- In Central America they make art with sawdust on Good Friday. These are called alfombras and are made from colourful sawdust. You can see these in Honduras, El Salvador and Guatemala.
- It's illegal to dance in Germany on Good Friday.
- In Bermuda, it is very common to fly a homemade kite.
- In Hungary, women are put into traditional costumes and then splashed with water.
- In South America, Easter is called Semana Santa, which means Holy Week in Spanish.
- To celebrate Easter in Australia, some people eat chocolate bilbies instead of chocolate rabbits. Bilbies are a native Australian marsupial.
- In Israel, on Palm Sunday, a stream of pilgrims descend the Mount of Olives, singing hymns and bearing palm fronds, re-enacting Jesus' entrance into Jerusalem.

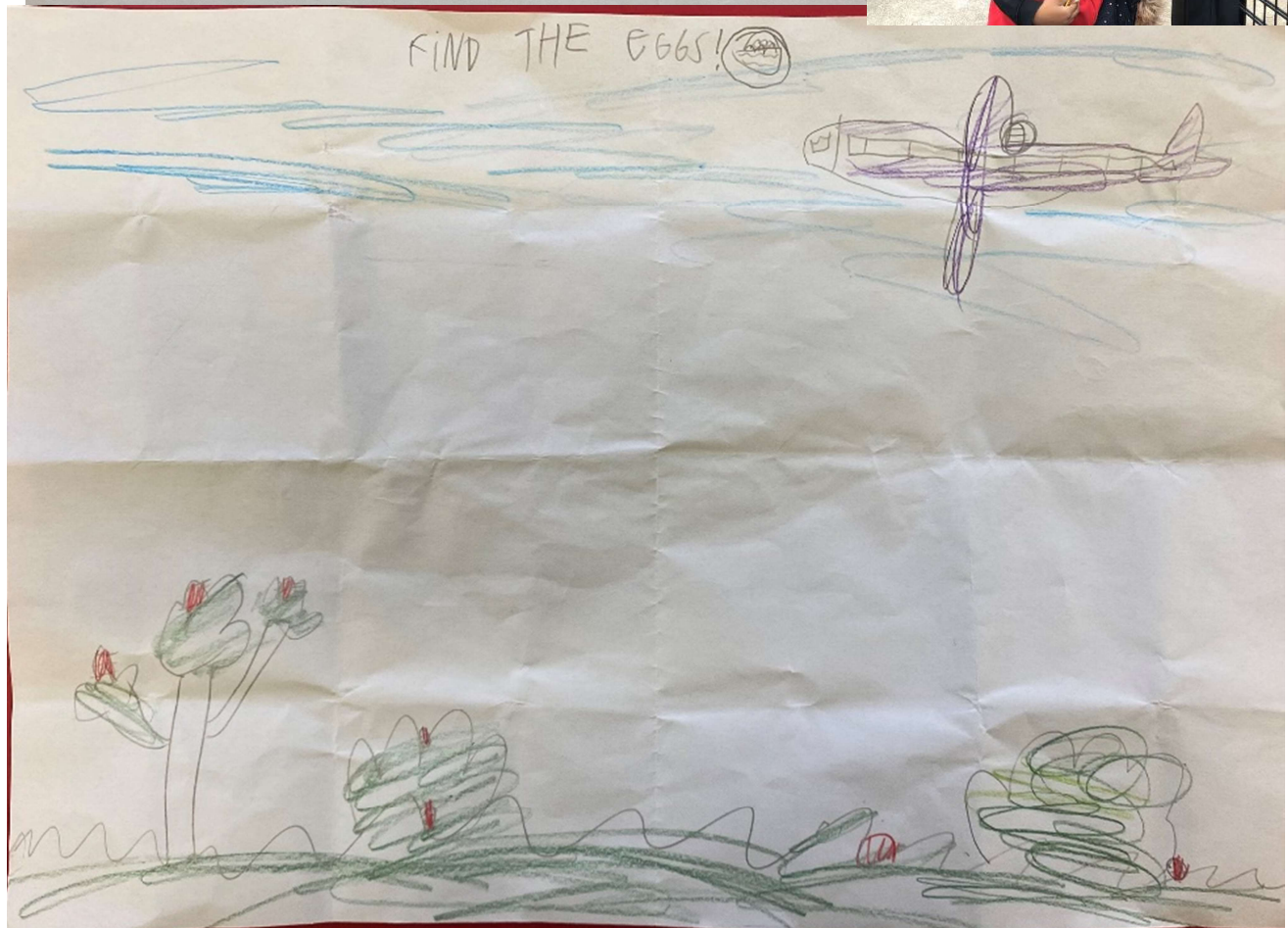


Red Nose Day by Hugo, 3R

Easter crafts!

1. Gingham eggs

Water down craft paint until it is the consistency of heavy cream. Paint vertical stripes down the sides of the egg. Don't use too much paint to avoid drips. Let your painting dry.

Next, paint horizontal stripes around the egg and let it dry. If desired, darken the overlapping squares of color with more paint to emphasize the gingham look.

2. Floral candles

Use a clean cloth to wipe a candle (any size will do). This will remove lint and debris for a smooth surface. Use paint markers or craft paint to draw a series of dots, flowers and patterns. Work on one side and let it dry completely before moving to another side.

3. Paint pen eggs

Here are some ideas and designs for painting eggs:

FLOWERS: Create flower patterns on the eggs, starting with dots. Expand on them to make more of a petal shape.

LEAVES: Make a vine pattern by drawing lines vertically from the top to the bottom of the egg. Add a leaf shape to the 'vine.' Let everything dry completely.

SWIRLS: For the abstract swirl pattern, create a swirl and add dots in between and around it. Make sure everything is dry before displaying!

4. Pretty patchwork basket

Cut a length of ribbon (I used 3 inches of wired ribbon) to create a large bow on the basket. Keep the tails long to allow for space for the decorative patches. Attach them using fabric glue.

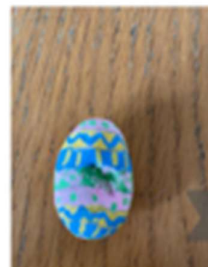
2. NOW, GET A PENCIL AND SKETCH OUT YOUR DESIGN, IT CAN BE ANYTHING.

2. get a sheet of paper and draw lines to look like rivers



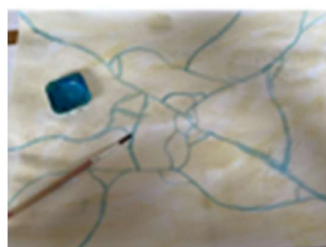
6. carefully rip the edges of the paper to make it look worn



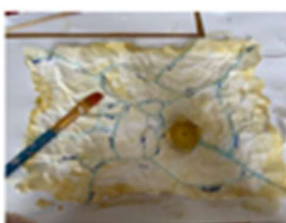
3. get some tan watercolour and cover the paper with a light coat

5. get a pen and draw squiggles to look like the names of the rivers

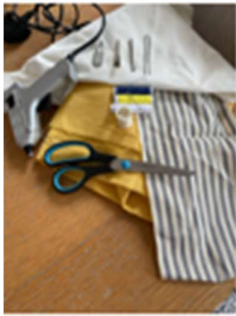

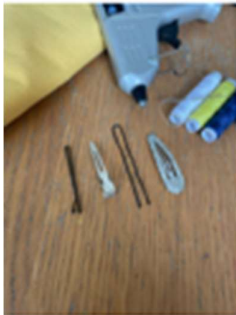
HOW TO MAKE A BUNNY EAR HAIR CLIP.

GLUE.



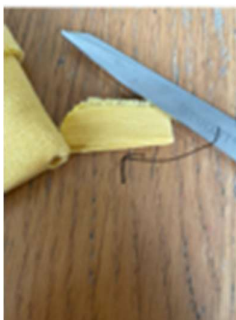
6. GLUE OR SEW

TOGETHER.



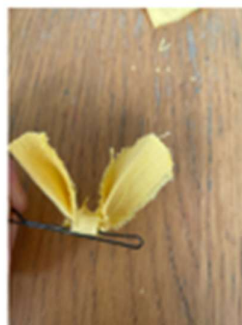
3. CUT A LONG OVAL

How to make a washcloth bunny!



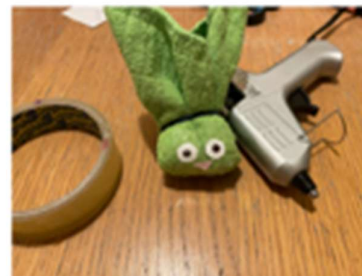
1. GET YOUR SUPPLIES. YOU WILL NEED A HAIR BAND, A PINK PEN, A BLACK PEN, SOME PAPER, (OR SOME GOOGLY EYES), TAPE/ GLUE, SCISSORS AND A WASHCLOTH.



5. GET A PIECE OF PAPER, DRAW EYES AND A NOSE ON, THEN CUT THEM OUT (YOU CAN USE GOOGLY EYES INSTEAD.)

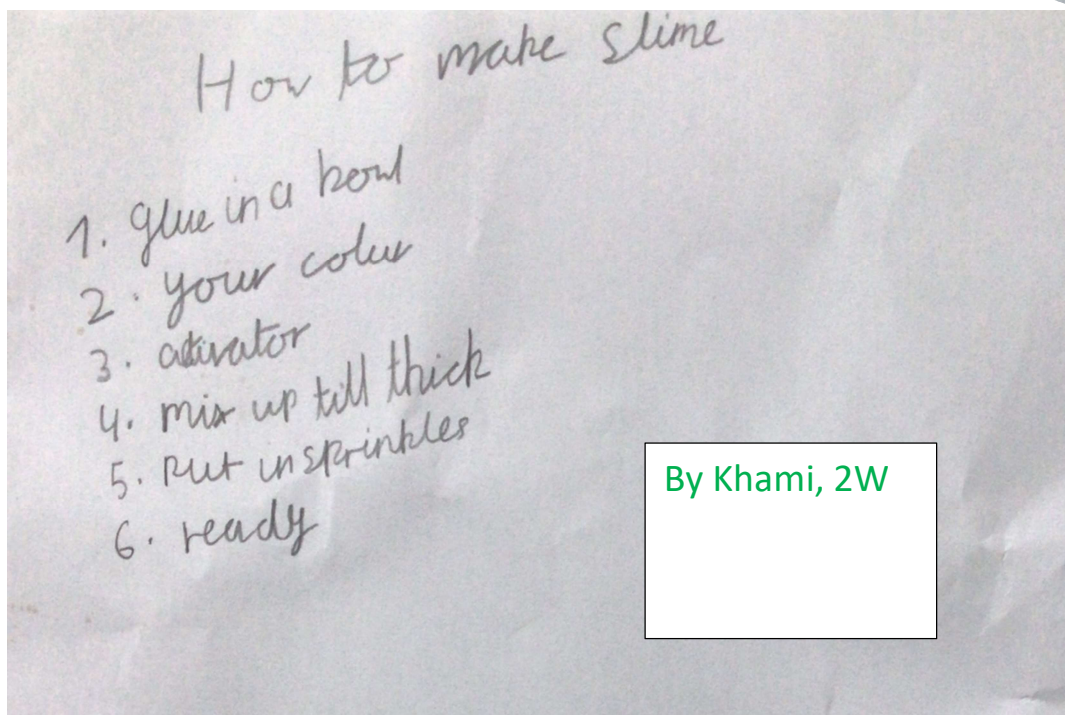
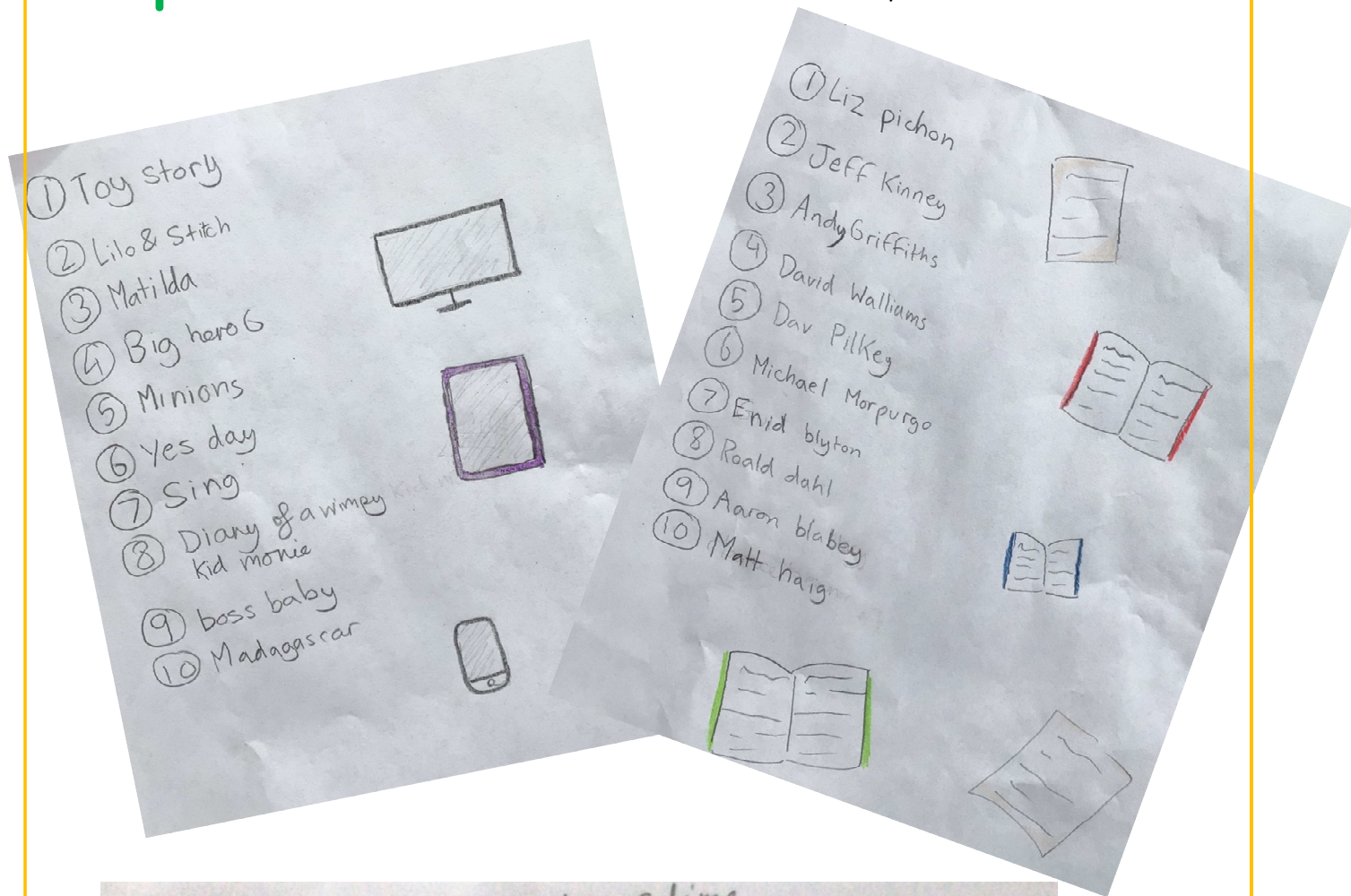

Cinnamon

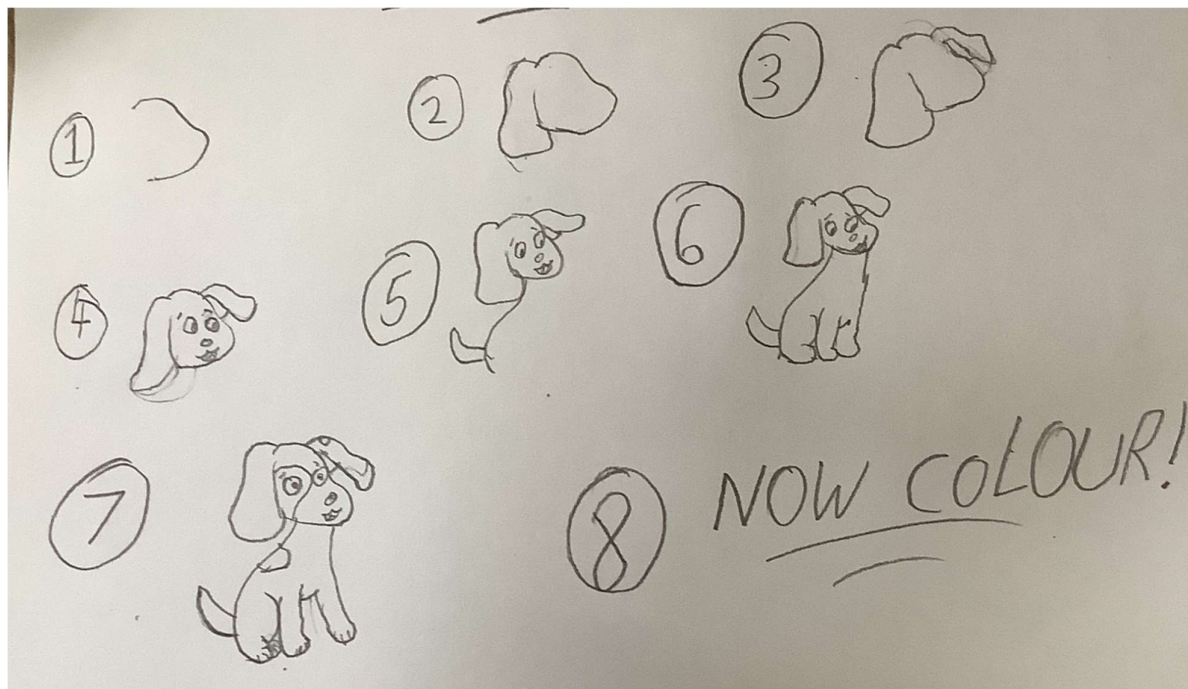
Chocolate chips (optional)

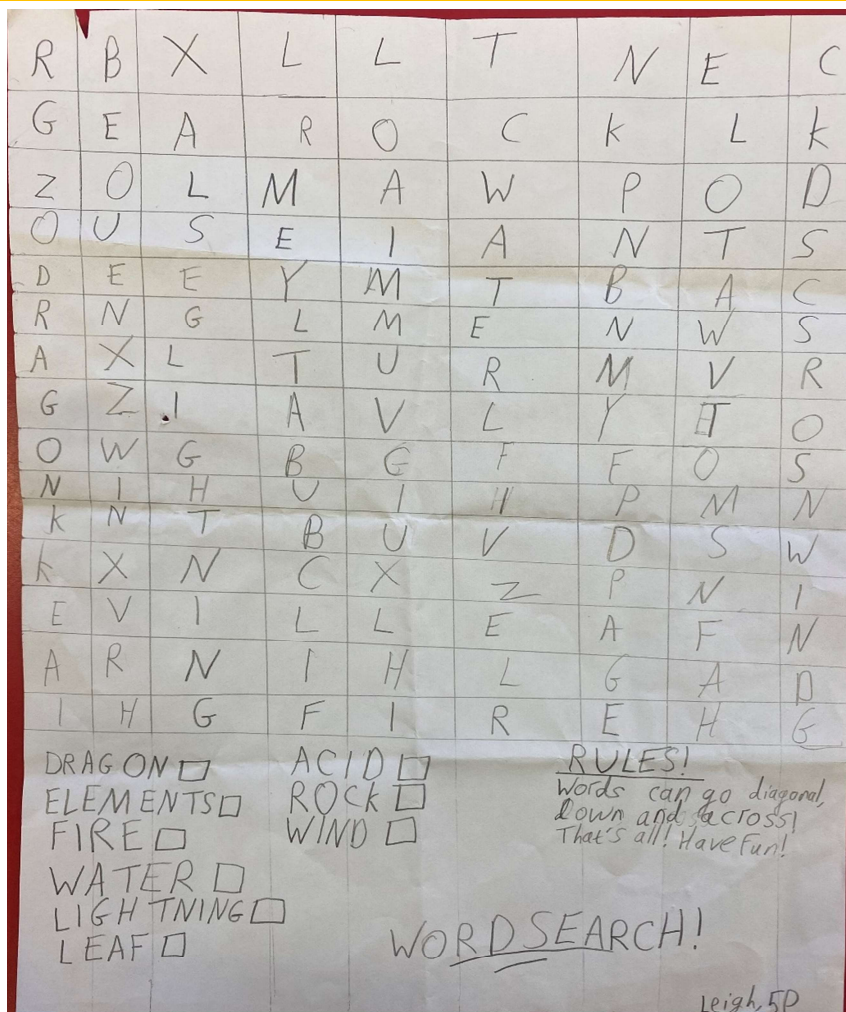
Method:

6. Wait for your toast to cool down and then comes the easy part. The tasting. Enjoy!

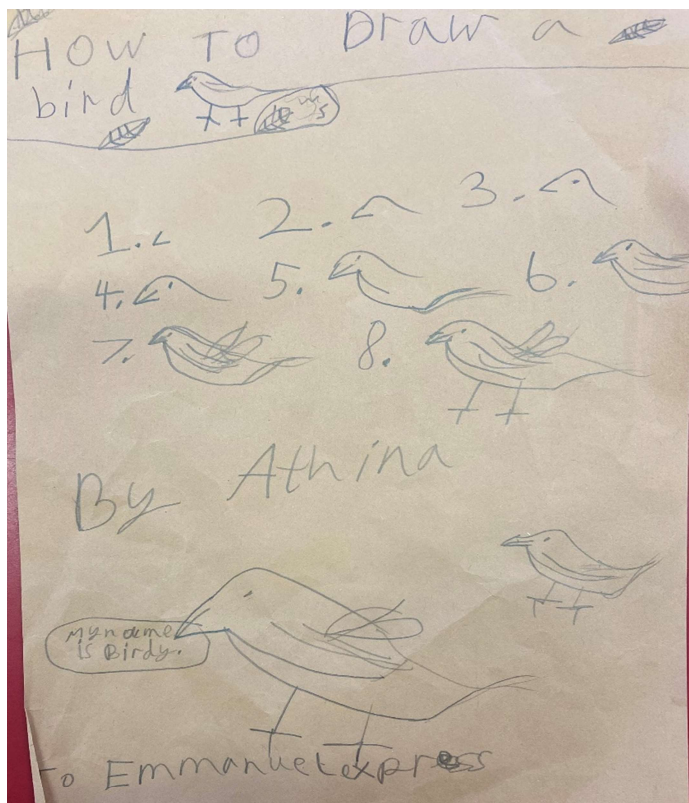
