KS2 School Council trip

On Thursday, the KS2 School Council team took part in a Camden Green Dragons' Den event to present to some local businesses and environmental organisations to be able to raise money for a new recycling project. Just like the TV programme, they had to pitch their project to four 'dragons' in order to request financial help to fund our project. The children have been researching what we currently do in terms of recycling, how much we throw away in the bin that we could recycle, how much new bins would cost us and how we would launch it to the school. As part of this they asked other pupils for their suggestions and spoke to members of the staff team for their input. During the event they also took part in environmental workshops such as Reducing clothing waste, Clean Air for Camden Schools, Recycling with Veolia and Rewilding and biodiversity - they particular enjoyed making seed bombs to take away and grow in their gardens! Well done to Natalie, Oliver, Avani, Benjamin, Olivya and Izabel, and to Liam and Zoe who also helped but couldn't attend. We are keeping our fingers crossed to hear the result as to how much money we will receive and will be launching it to all the whole school in the summer term. Dear Emmanuel Families,

Next week is Holy Week, a week in which we recall the events that took place in the final days of Jesus' life. These different events show us so much about human nature – our ability to show love and devotion and our capacity for betrayal and denial. This is a week that holds for us the full spectrum of our experience of life, a week when we can be honest about the suffering and the darkness as well as look forward to a celebration that love and light will have the final word.

To help our children engage with the events of Holy Week we have set up a room in school, where the children will enter into these stories through play and exploration. They may choose to make play dough bread to recall the Last Supper, or to write thank you prayers to demonstrate their love for their friends and teachers. They might spend time on a puzzle of a world map and think about other parts of the world that need our care and attention. There will be a corner for them to plant seeds to remind us that Jesus spoke of how seeds that are buried in the ground will bear fruit. Or they might

snuggle up with a blanket in a beautiful cosy space and listen to music.



Supporting our pupils' Mental Health and Wellbeing All welcome - Parent/carer workshop

Save the date! Thursday 18 April at 2-3pm Supporting children at home with big emotions -Zoom workshop

Does your child struggle with their emotions at home? Do they have angry outbursts, tantrums, anxious episodes, show defiant behaviours, struggle with change or appear withdrawn? Sometimes it may feel completely out of the blue.



Our parents/carers are invited to our next Zoom workshop which will share information, ideas and strategies on how to support children who show emotional dysregulation. This includes:

- Understanding the Zones of Regulation framework and how we use it at school.
- How to use 'Emotions Coaching' to support children to understand and recognise their emotions, guiding them through reflection and problem solving to agree what they could do differently to ensure they make good choices in future.
- Discuss and share ideas that can help prevent big emotions: understand what's in their control and not in their control; setting boundaries for behaviour and knowing when itis the right time to have a conversation about their emotions and behaviours; challenging negative thoughts which can overwhelm them in the moment; and tips for positive wellbeing.
- Building resilience and coping skills to help with changes and events which can cause additional stress such as tests, assemblies, changes at home and changing schools.


