

Sports Premium - Impact of Funding 2018/2019



Key indicator 1: The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity - Chief Medical Officer Guidelines recommend that primary school children undertake at least 30 minutes of physical activity a day in school

Improve the quality of teaching spaces, provisions and resources for playground space

- Replaced old equipment to promote physical activity in the playground. This enabled children to participate in a wider range of activities, such as uni hockey, dodgeball and tennis.
- Re-stocked PE equipment as needed for children to access the correct resources to maximise their learning experience and outcomes.
- The MUGA baseboards were replaced with all-weather panels. Line markings for basketball were added.
- A separate storage shed was purchased to contain playtime equipment. This meant that we could separate curriculum and playtime equipment to promote longevity.

Key indicator 2: The profile of PE and Sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement

Raising the Emmanuel PE profile within the school and around the community

- Sporting activities and match reports/results promoted through the weekly school newsletter to inform parents.
- The website was regularly updated to inform parents and the wider community of upcoming competitions and results.

- Website links to outside sports clubs provided to give information on sporting activities and coaches available in the local area, For example; *Quadkids, Hampstead Rugby Club, Highgate Harriers etc.*
- Photos of Emmanuel children participating in both competitions and PE lessons posted on the website to raise and promote the profile of sport.
- Swimming caps purchased with the Emmanuel logo. Children were provided with these when representing the school at the annual swimming competition.

Key indicator 3: Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport

To continue to increase high quality PE teaching and learning throughout whole school through team teaching.

- Subject leader attended PE leadership course with other leaders in Camden to discuss curriculum planning and assessment, planning and evaluating the impact of the PE premium and to find out about the latest national and local guidance. This was vital for the school to accurately self-evaluate the provision we had in place to maintain high quality PE teaching and learning. This was also helpful for the subject leader when discussing assessment and evaluation with Ofsted.
- PE specialist delivered high quality PE lessons to up-level teacher's subject knowledge and quality of their own lessons.

Key indicator 4: Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils

Continue to monitor children's interest and implement new clubs where possible to include new sports and increase the opportunities for all children

- Continued to audit children's interests. Identified that there was a broad range of clubs that children would be interested in, including KS2 Hip Hop, Tennis, Cricket and Chess. These after school/ before school clubs were introduced throughout the year when space and staffing allowed. These clubs were in demand and children were on a waiting list.
- An average of 61% Key stage 2 children participated in sport before and after school clubs throughout the year. 59% pupil premium children participated in these clubs in the Summer Term.

Key indicator 5: Increased participation in competitive sport

Continue to increase provision for INTRA and INTER competition for children to take part in competitive sports

- 95% of KS2 children represented Emmanuel in at least 1 inter competition against other Camden schools. Results as follows;
 - 1st place boys football tournament
 - Runners up in girls basketball
 - 2nd place Camden cricket competition
 - 4th place Sports Hall athletics (Winner of Small Schools)
 - 4th place Camden athletes (Winners of Small Schools)
 - 5th place Y3/4 football tournament
 - 5th place at Camden netball competition.
 - 5th place Camden cross country.
 - 6th place Camden football league
 - 7th place Camden swimming competition

*Small school are catergorised as one form entry schools
