**Topic: Nurturing Nurses/
Toys**

Gentle Reminders

Wednesday - Spelling and Maths quizzes

Monday - PE

Homework given out on Fridays and due back on Tuesdays.

Reading should be happening **every night** at home for 20 mins.

Numeracy

Ongoing: oral and mental skills.

The principal focus is to ensure that developing confidence and mental fluency with whole numbers, counting and place value. We will be working with numerals, words and the four operations, including with practical resources (for example, concrete objects and measuring tools).

COMPUTING - Computational thinking

Children will be learning how to navigate through a range of digital and online activities and games, how to make choices when exploring real and imaginary situations, how to combine a series of actions or steps that can be used to solve problems.

RE - Christianity/ Hinduism

For the first half term, we will be learning about the parables of Jesus and thinking about why it is important to listen and remember the stories Jesus told? In Summer II, we will be learning about Hinduism and finding out about the Importance of Symbols, Beliefs and Teachings of Hinduism.

P.E -Athletics

Children will master basic movements including running, jumping, throwing & catching, developing balance, agility & co-ordination.

PSHE

In the first half term, we will be discussing how humans and animals grow and change over their lives. Later in the term, we will be looking at how we keep ourselves safe and who we can go to for help both in school, at home and in our local communities.

LITERACY

On-going: Spelling, Handwriting, Reading

Children should read for at least 20 minutes each night and record their reading in their reading records.

Adventure Story - Children will be exploring the book "Where the Wild Things Are". We will be using it as stimulus for a range of different writing activities such as diary entries, setting descriptions, fact files on the wild things and our own adventure stories.

The children will also be looking at how we can use adjectives and similes to add detail to our stories as well as focusing on prefixes and suffixes.

The children will also be preparing for the phonics screening by practicing their phonics sounds and blending.

SCIENCE - Plants

Children will be learning to identify and name a variety of common wild and garden plants, including deciduous and evergreen trees. They will also be focusing on identifying and describing the basic structure of a variety of common flowering plants, including trees.

TOPIC/HISTORY -Mary Seacole and Florence

Nightingale/ Toys

For the first half term, we will study the lives of Florence Nightingale and Mary Seacole. We will focus on understanding the main problems with the treatment of soldiers prior to Florence Nightingale's arrival and the changes Florence and Mary made.

In Summer II we will be learning about popular toys from the 20th century and the early 21st century. The children will be encouraged to ask and answer questions, identify and interpret different sources and recognise change and explore how this influences them today.

ART/DT

Children will be studying Paul Klee and his paintings. We will use geometric shapes to create castles using oil pastels. In DT, we will be doing some cooking based on a traditional royal tea party, which we will recreate later in the term.
