



Pupil Premium 2013-2014

Pupil Premium is funding we receive from the government. It is in addition to our main school funding and is allocated to address the underlying inequalities between children. The pupil premium is allocated at the rate of £900 per pupil who is eligible for Free School Meals (FSM), has been eligible for FSM in the past 6 years (Known as Ever6FSM), or has ever been looked after by the local authority.

In 2013/2014 the school receives £39,600 pupil premium funding. The table below shows the summary of how this funding will be used.

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How do we know it is making a difference?

We track the progress of all our pupils in school on a termly basis and we compare children according to different characteristics including FSM. We use our own internal analysis systems and RAISEOnline to monitor attainment and progress. We also track carefully the impact of any additional support we provide eg intervention.

- One To One Tuition delivered by an experienced teacher in years 5 and 6.

- Small class teaching for core subjects facilitated by 3 experienced teachers in KS2.
