My name is PCSO Karen Monaghan from the Fortune Green Safer Neighbourhood team. At the moment there is a strong Neighbourhood Watch (NHW) forming in the local area. If you would like to receive regular emails from Police that are relevant to your area you can sign up to NHW by sending your email address and the road you live in to; FortuneGreen.SNT.@met.police.uk

You will be put onto a circulation list which is 100% confidential.

Once on this list you will receive crime updates, crime prevention strategies, critical incidents and details of crime trends in your area. You will also receive information on local events such as free crime prevention talks, free bike marking, meeting times to talk to police face to face and community events. In addition you will also have a direct email to me so we can deal with localised issues that affect you quickly and effectively. No fees are involved with NHW and you don't have to have meetings (unless you want to!). A key focus of NHW is simply receiving helpful and important information and looking out for each other I look forward to hearing from you.
