It got extremely exciting when they created a Viking boat to sail to Northumbria and raid a Monastery! The children were captivated and it was the perfect way to start our new topic all about the Vikings!



### **Quartz History Workshop – Elizabethan Times**

On the 7<sup>th</sup> June 2016 Quartz enjoyed the amazing Elizabethan workshop by “Jolly John”. The children described it as funny, interesting, inclusive and definitely not boring! During the workshop everybody learned something and in a fun and interactive way. They learnt all about famous Elizabethan people and Shakespeare’s life. 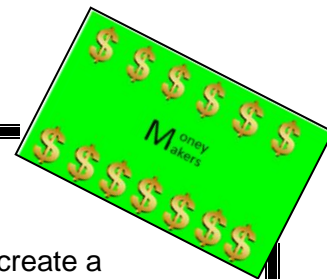
### **Year 5/6 Girls and Boys Football Competition**
