Sing Up Award- Silver!

I would like to say a huge well done to Mrs Waller-Box and Miss Granger for all their hard work in working towards and achieving our Silver Sing Up Award. The feedback from the assessor was so lovely we think it deserves to be shared with our whole school community.

To all staff and pupils at Emmanuel CE Primary school,

I am pleased to endorse your Silver Sing Up award and congratulate the staff and students on this achievement. Your evidence demonstrates some very hard work and a clear commitment to singing across the school. You have met the criteria for each award and have achieved your plan. It is clear that your Awards champion Deirdre Waller - Box has worked extremely hard on detailed planning and documentation and that she is passionate about the vital role that singing can play in your school. You clearly also have other very talented and committed staff singing leaders including your Spanish teacher!

You submitted some super pieces of evidence, such as the class assembly videos and I loved the candle lit song. It was great to see the concert for individual singers which included a professional performer and an ex pupil, what a lovely way to inspire your young singers. I was particularly impressed with how you have considered the standard of your singing and have been able to focus on paying attention to the detail of singing with quality.

Also extremely impressive is the Big Sing event, this piece of evidence is really super. Lovely that governors are involved. Staff are clearly involved in your journey and you have now extended this to playground staff demonstrating that school recognize the benefits singing can have on managing behaviour. You submit excellent evidence illustrating documentation of delivering CPD in staff meetings. Using the achievement of the Sing Up Award as one of your Performance Management targets is a brilliant way to embed singing within the school and focus your journey. Your evidence shows an excellent variety of songs and resources within a wide range of contexts. Your repertoire is challenging and exciting.

I believe that your school will be a strong candidate for a Gold Sing Up Award and I would encourage you to take this further.

Relationship and Sex Education
