A letter went home with all the details but below are a few reminders of some important points.

- They can wear their own clothes (weather appropriate) and swimming costume/shorts underneath ready to paddle in the sea.
- They need a spare set of clothes in case they need to change and a towel.
- They need a packed lunch. The seagulls are notorious so preferably in sealed containers and bags rather than plastic carrier bags.
- We are due back at 4.30pm. Please wait at the back gate and we will bring them out in to the playground so you can collect your child from the teacher as usual.

Parents who volunteer must be aware that they are needed to support a group of children at all times. You will be responsible for a group and not just your own child and you will need to be able to go into the sea to form a 'human chain' to enable the children to paddle safely.

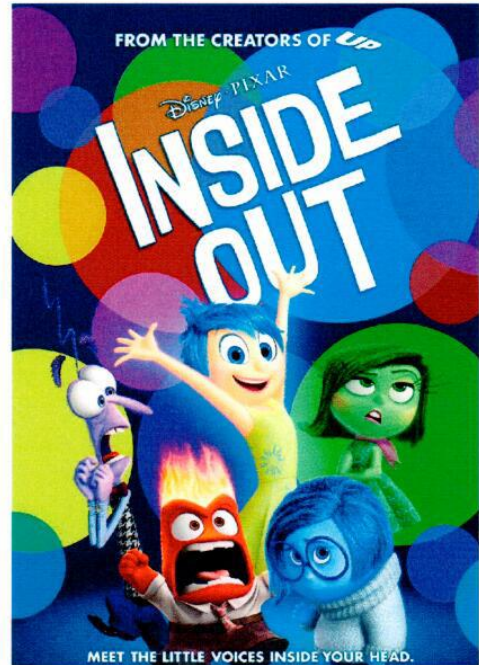
