(2 SEN, 1 EAL, 1 new arrival Jan'16 and 1 who struggled with the test)</p> <p>-2 pupil premium pupils did not reach the expected standard in reading. Both these pupils are SEN and all SEN needs are literacy based- word and language decoding and hearing impairment.</p> <p>-2 pupil premium pupils reached the higher standard (110+ scaled score)</p> <p>-In total 5/14 pupils reached the higher standard.</p>	<p>In total 5/14 pupils did not reach the expected standard. (3 SEN, 1 EAL, 1 new arrival Jan'16)</p> <p>-2 pupil premium pupils did not meet the expected standard in writing. Both pupils are SEN and all SEN needs are literacy based- word and language decoding and hearing impairment.</p> <p>-1 non pupil premium pupil was working at greater depth.</p>	<p>-2 pupil premium pupils did meet the expected standard. Both children are SEN with literacy based needs.</p> <p>-2 pupil premium pupils reached the higher standard.</p>	<p>-In total 2/14 pupils did not make the expected standard. (1 pupil SEN and 1 new arrival Jan '16)</p> <p>-1 pupil premium pupil did not make the expected standard. This pupil had a SEN and scored 98- (2 scaled scores away from 100).</p> <p>-3 pupil premium pupils achieved the expected standard.</p> <p>-3 non pupil premium pupils reached the higher standard.</p>

Non Pupil Premium pupils outperformed the Pupil Premium pupils in all areas. Two of four pupil premium pupils had a SEN. 2/4 made the expected standard in Reading and Writing.3/4 made the expected standard in Maths.
